Purpose of the Letter:

Seller's Obligations:

3. The Seller shall cooperate with the Buyer to verify the authenticity of the provided documents upon request.
4. The Seller shall notify the Buyer promptly if any material document becomes unavailable or if there is any change affecting the validity of the document.

Confidentiality:

Both parties agree that all documentation and information exchanged pursuant to this Letter shall be treated as confidential, shall not be disclosed to third parties except as required by law, regulation, or with prior written consent of the other party.

Limitation of Liability:

Neither party shall be liable for any indirect, incidental, special, consequential, or punitive damages arising out of or related to this Letter or the provision of the Proof, except for damages arising from gross negligence, fraud, or willful misconduct.

Governing Law and Jurisdiction:
